## POOL TO OPEN AT WEEK-END

IT HAS BEEN DECIDED TO OPEN THE BRALORNE SWIMMING POOL FOR THE HOLIDAY WEEK-END. ADMISSION TO THE POOL, WHICH WILL BE OPEN ON SATURDAY AND SUNDAY FROM 12 NOON UNTIL DUSK, WILL BE FREE TO LOCAL RESIDENTS.

SEASON TICKETS ARE NOW AVAILABLE FOR THE POOL, WITH PRICES SET AS LAST YEAR. FAMILY SEASON TICKETS ARE \$5.00, SINGLE TICKETS \$3.00, AND DAILY ADMISSION 25¢ TO MEMBERS OF THE BRALORNE COMMUNITY CLUB. ALL OUTSIDERS WHO WISH TO USE THE POOL WILL PAY DOUBLE THE ABOVE RATES.

## IMPROVEMENTS TO HOSPITAL GROUNDS

READERS WILL HAVE NOTICED THE REMENDOUS AMOUNT OF WORK WHICH IS NOW BEING DONE BY THE COMPANY IN AN ENDEAVOUR TO BEAUTIFY THE GROUNDS OF THE BRALORNE HOSPITAL. THE LANDSCAPING OF THE GROUNDS WILL ADD MUCH TO THE SETTING OF THE HOSPITAL, WHICH IS NOW SERVING THE WHOLE OF THE VALLEY, AND WHICH WILL BE IN GRAVE DANGER OF OVER-CROWDING DURING THE NEXT FEW YEARS UNLESS THERE IS SOME EXTENSION PLANNED TO ACCOMMODATE THE LARGE NUMBERS OF CONSTRUCTION WORKERS WHO ARE EXPECTED IN THE LOWER VALLEY WITHIN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS. THIS IS A MATTER WHICH COULD BE WELL BROUGHT UP WITH THE COMPANIES CONCERNED.

## NEW ROAD PLANNED IN VALLEY

THE B.C. ELECTRIC COMPANY ANNOUNCED THIS WEEK THE PLANS FOR A NEW TWO-LANE HIGHWAY ABOVE THE DIVERSION DAM, CONFORMING TO B.C. STANDARDS OF NEW HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION.

A TOTAL OF 40 MILES OF HIGHWAY IN THE VALLEY WILL BE REPLACED BY NEW CONSTRUCTION AT A HIGHER LEVEL, BECAUSE THE RIVER LEVEL WILL BE RAISED SOME 140 FEET BY THE NEW DIVERSION DAM.

ALL RESIDENTS OF THE VALLEY, AND ALL WHO ARE ATTRACTED BY THE NATURAL BEAUTIES OF THIS PROVINCE WILL EARNESTLY HOPE THAT BEFORE THE VALLEY IS FLOODED, THE TREES WILL BE CUT DOWN BY THE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY. NO ONE WHO HAS SEEN THE SAD SPECTACLE OF THE STANDING DEAD AND DYING TREES IN THE LOWER VALLEY WOULD WISH FOR AN EXTENSION OF THIS DEVASTATION. IT IS POSSIBLE TO CLEAN UP THE BRUSH AND TREES BEHIND ANY DAM - IT HAS BEEN DONE MANY TIMES THROUGHOUT NORTH AMERICA - AND ALL POWER COMPANIES SHOULD BE FORCED TO PROVIDE A BEAUTIFUL ARTIFICIAL LAKE AT THEIR DAM SITES.

THE MAJOR OBJECTION TO CLEARING IS THE EXPENSE INVOLVED, BUT THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD SEE TO IT THAT THOSE WHO WISH TO EMPLOY OUR NATURAL RESOURCES SHOULD BE MADE TO CLEAN UP THE JOB AFTERWARDS, AND NOT LEAVE THE AREA IN A STATE WHICH CAN ONLY BE DESCRIBED AS AN "ABOMINATION OF DESOLATION".

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### HUGE CONTRACT AWARDED

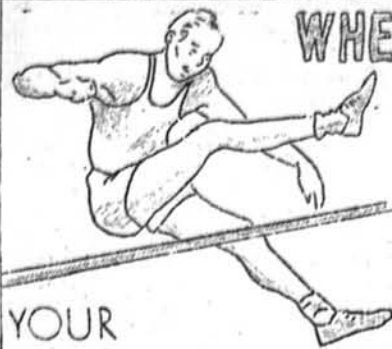
A \$25,000,000 CONTRACT HAS BEEN AWARDED TO NORTHERN CONSTRUCTION AND J.W. STEWART LTD. FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW 190 FOOT DAM ON THE BRIDGE RIVER, AND A NEW POWERHOUSE ON SETON LAKE.

THE NEW DAM, ABOUT 45 MILES DOWNSTREAM FROM LAJOIE, WILL BE ABOUT 1000 FEET IN THICKNESS, WITH A BASE 1200 FEET ACROSS. IT WILL RAISE THE LEVEL OF THE RIVER BY ABOUT 140 FEET.

WHEN THE DAM IS COMPLETED, THE MISSION BRIDGE WILL BE ABANDONED, AND WILL BE REPLACED BY A NEW BRIDGE OVER THE SPILLWAY OF THE NEW DAM.

TWO CAMP SITES, EACH CAPABLE OF HOLDING 400 MEN, ARE BEING ERECTED NEAR THE DAM SITE AND NEAR THE POWER-HOUSE SITE. A THIRD CAMP, OF SIMILAR SIZE, HAS BEEN COMPLETED AT THE BRIDGE RIVER END OF THE MISSION MOUNTAIN TUNNEL. WHEN THE ENTIRE PROJECT REACHES PEAK ACTIVITY, LATER IN THE YEAR, IT WILL PROVIDE EMPLOYMENT FOR ABOUT 2000 MEN.

ALTHOUGH THE RESPONSE TO THIS NOTIFICATION WAS VERY SATISFACTORY, MANY OLD CERTIFICATES HAVE NOT YET BEEN RENEWED AND IT IS DESIRED TO IMPRESS ON ALL SUCH WEAPON OWNERS WHO STILL HOLD CERTIFICATES DATED PRIOR TO JANUARY 1, 1952 THAT THEY MUST IMMEDIATELY TAKE STEPS TO HAVE THEIR FIREARMS PROPERLY REGISTERED.

THE NEW TYPE CERTIFICATE HAS BEEN IN EFFECT UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE CRIMINAL CODE SINCE JANUARY 1952. ALL THAT IS REQUIRED OF HOLDERS OF THE OLD CERTIFICATE IS TO FORWARD THEM TO:-

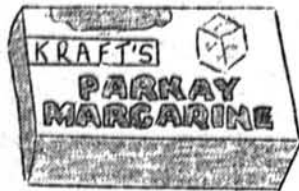
