BRALORNE PIONEER MINERS COME TO AID OF TRAPPED MEN

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 1ST AROUND 11:00 A.M. PERCY McDONALD OF PORT MOODY AND PAT McDONALD OF COQUITLAM WERE TRAPPED IN A MINE AT GOLDEN CONTACT.

WORD WAS RECEIVED AT BRALORNE TELEPHONE OFFICE AND THEY TRANSFERRED THE INFORMATION TO MR. C. CAMPBELL, MANAGER OF THE BRALORNE PIONEER MINES LTD. MR. CAMPBELL IMMEDIATELY SET HIS SUPERINTENDANT, MR. J. THOMSON AND SAFETY ENGINEER, MR. U. LEE INTO ACTION AND GOT A COMPLETE RESCUE CREW AND EQUIPMENT INTO SERVICE AND THEN CONTACTED THE B.C. MINES DEPARTMENT, WHO SENT A HELICOPTER TO TRANSFER THE MEN FROM BRALORNE TO THE MINE CAVE-IN.

HOWEVER DUE TO BAD WEATHER IT WAS IMPOSSIBLE TO GET THE MEN IN THIS WAY AND SO THEY TRAVELLED BY CAR TO SHALALTH WHERE A P.C.E. SPEEDER WAS WAITING TO TAKE THEM TO TRUCKS AND JEPS FOR THE TRIP UP TO THE GOLDEN CONTACT. THE RESCUERS REACHED THE ALMOST INACCESSIBLE MINE OVER A ROAD BUILT IN THREE HOURS BY B.C. ELECTRIC CATERPILLAR.

THE RESCUERS WORKED ON THEIR HANDS AND KNEES FOR NEARLY THIRTY HOURS TO GET THE MEN. TWO MEN AT A TIME SHOVELLED SHOULDER TO SHOULDER IN A THREE FOOT TUNNEL. WORK WAS SLOW BECAUSE OF THE DEBRIS THAT KEPT FALLING.

ABOUT FORTY MEN INCLUDING A CRACK EIGHT MAN MINE RESCUE TEAM FROM BRALORNE PIONEER MINES TOOK PART IN THE RESCUE. THE RESCUE TEAM CONSISTED OF GEO. VOORO JULIO PIEROBON, CARL KEEIN, ED KRUGER, ALLAN MORRISON. OTHERS WHO HELPED ON THE JOB WERE JOHNNY COURCHESNE, AL CRITTENDEN, GUS DUPASQUIER, WALTER YASNOWSKI, PAUL DASE, RED OBRE, GEO. PISKORZ AND W. THIESSEN WHO SUPERVISED THE WORK. THE OTHER SEVEN OF THESE MINERS DO NOT BELONG TO A MINE RESCUE TEAM BUT DID THEIR SHARE ALONG WITH THE OTHERS. AFTER THE RESCUE ON JUNE THE 2ND THE MEN RETURNED TO BRALORNE AND THEY WERE THEN TAKEN TO KAMLOOPS WHERE THE B.C. MINE RESCUE AND FIRST AID COMPETITIONS WERE TAKEN PLACE ON SATURDAY.

AT KAMLOOPS, BRALORNE PIONEER MINES NO. 1 TEAM TOOK TOP HONORS IN THE REGIONAL MINE RESCUE COMPETITION. COMPETING AGAINST TEAMS FROM CARIBOU GOLD QUARTZ, GIANT NICKEL, BRITANNIA MINES, HIGHLAND BELL AND BRALORNE PIONEER MINES NO. 2 TEAM.

THE STORY IS THIS: I BOUGHT THE PROPERTY FROM THE B.O.
